Left Brain, Right Brain and Multiple Intelligences



Learning and teaching were joyful experiences for students in EDUC 563 Visual Arts for Educators in Wethersfield this past Fall 2 session! With Mary Grace Cianci as instructor, students explored a bit of neuroscience and brain function before experimenting with graphic design and pattern analysis. The integration of the arts into curriculum at all levels provides opportunities for students with different ability levels and interest to engage with the curriculum through multiple modalities and encourages creative opportunities to express ideas and explore concepts, another iteration of Universal Design for Learning! The picture on the left shows a student in the class, Greg Garcia, who is also a high school English teacher at the

Greater Hartford Academy of the Arts. In the photo, he is observing plant and animal cellular samples on a microscope. Students were asked to observe the slides and then create a colored art piece. This was inspired by the art of a synthetic biologist who specializes in florescence microscopy. Zoe Mendal, a high school biology teacher in Bristol, led the class in learning about this artist and how to incorporate visual arts in science classes.



Will robots or other technologies eventually replace teachers? According to a recent article published by the Christensen Institute, educational technology can enhance the learning process in many ways. It CAN"T perform at least three critical functions:

- (1) Technology can't get to know a student—"Real knowing and understanding is a human-to-human experience."
- (2) Technology can't care about a student even the best software "can't offer a sense of genuine caring."
- (3) Technology can't provide higher-order feedback or coach soft skills like setting personal goals and overcoming obstacles
